(U 904 G) for Authority to Update its Gas  
Revenue Requirement and Base Rates Effective  
on January 1, 2016.

**GENERAL RATE CASE APPLICATION OF  
SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY (U 904 G)**

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Southern California Gas Company (“SoCalGas” or “SCG”) respectfully requests authority to update its Test Year 2016 (“TY 2016”) gas revenue requirement and base rates, effective January 1, 2016, and to implement a post-test year ratemaking mechanism for subsequent years. Incorporated in this General Rate Case (“GRC”) filing is a TY 2016 cost of service study, pursuant to which SoCalGas’ rates should be set beginning January 1, 2016.

SoCalGas’ GRC Application requests that the California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission” or “CPUC”) authorize a \$2.4 billion revenue requirement, to be effective January 1, 2016. If approved, this revenue requirement would be an increase of \$256 million over the estimated 2015 revenue requirement, or a 12% increase. When the impact of commodity costs and other ratemaking items such as regulatory account balances are included, these increases result in a 2016 system total bundled revenue increase of \$204 million (or 4.7%) over estimated 2015 rates. If the 2016 revenue requirement identified above is approved by the Commission, an average residential customer (using 39 therms per month) can expect a bill increase of \$2.75 per month (or 5.5%), as compared to estimated 2015 rates.

The proposed post-test year ratemaking mechanism would be used to set rates beginning January 1, 2017. Rates in 2018 will be adjusted using the same mechanism (*see* Post-Test Year Ratemaking testimony of Ronald van der Leeden, Exhibit SCG-35).

SoCalGas specifically seeks authority to adjust its 2016 revenue requirement consistent with the schedule requirements set forth in the Rate Case Plan as established in decisions (“D.”) 07-07-004, 04-12-015 and 89-01-040, and its 2012 GRC Decision (D.13-05-010). SoCalGas sets forth below additional detail on its proposal and a recommended procedural schedule.

## **I. ACCEPTANCE OF THE NOTICE OF INTENT (“NOI”)**

On July 25, 2014, SoCalGas tendered its TY 2016 GRC NOI in accordance with the Rate Case Plan to the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (“ORA”). On September 12, 2014, the NOI was accepted. A NOI-to-Application comparison exhibit is being served concurrently with this Application.

## **II. SUMMARY OF RELIEF REQUESTED**

The GRC Application will seek authorization to revise SoCalGas’ current base rate revenues to recover its projected costs of SoCalGas’ gas operations, facilities and infrastructure, and other functions necessary to provide utility services to its customers. In general, SoCalGas has examined the specific changes the company expects to occur over the term of this GRC and are proposing corresponding investments in, among other things:

- **Safety and Reliability:** SoCalGas will continue to invest in its gas delivery system to enhance the safety, reliability, and to manage risks. One example is the continuing evolution of the Transmission and Distribution Integrity Management Programs (“TIMP” and “DIMP”).
- **Customer Service:** SoCalGas will continue to invest in the needs of over 21 million consumers by, among other things, empowering customers with information and tools to better manage their gas use.
- **Risk Management:** SoCalGas will continue to prioritize safety, reliability and security risk management, while taking steps to enhance its existing risk management policies and practices.
- **Environmental Stewardship:** SoCalGas will continue to provide services in an ecologically responsible manner, complying with an increasing number of regulations and requirements, factoring environmental impacts in project planning, and investing in technologies that advance clean energy for customers and the environment.
- **Supplier Diversity:** SoCalGas will continue its strong commitment to investing in efforts and programs that enhance supplier diversity, including particular focus on helping diverse small business suppliers.

#### **IV. SUMMARY OF THE POST-TEST YEAR RATEMAKING MECHANISM**

SoCalGas proposes a post-test year ratemaking mechanism to adjust the authorized revenue requirement in the post-test years by applying separate attrition adjustments for O&M expenses (including a separate attrition adjustment for medical expenses) and capital-related costs. Adoption of this mechanism will provide SoCalGas with sufficient revenues during the post-test year period to continue providing safe and reliable service to customers, while providing a fair opportunity for SoCalGas to earn the authorized rate of return. The proposed post-test year ratemaking mechanism is described in the prepared direct testimony of Ronald van der Leeden (Exhibit SCG-35).

#### **V. OTHER ISSUES**

##### **A. Risk Testimonies**

The TY 2016 GRC Application is accompanied by direct testimonies addressing risk and risk management. The Risk Management and Policy testimony of Diana Day (Exhibit SCG-02) describes SoCalGas’ current risk management practices, its vision and commitment to continued enhancement of those practices and progress toward an integrated Enterprise Risk Management organization. The testimony of Douglas Schneider (Exhibit SCG-03) describes SoCalGas’ strong safety culture and its risk management policy and efforts for gas operations.

##### **B. Regulatory Accounts Proposals**

SoCalGas will present its regulatory accounts proposals. SoCalGas proposes to continue with modifications, the Pension Balancing Account (“PBA”), PBOP Balancing Account (“PBOPBA”), NERBA, Post-2011 DIMP Balancing Account (“Post-2011 DIMPBA”), TIMP Balancing Account (“TIMPBA”) and Compressor Station Fuel and Power Balancing Account (“CFPBA”). Furthermore, SoCalGas requests to continue the existing Research, Development and Demonstration Expense Account (“RDDEA”), Core Fixed Cost Account (“CFCA”) and Noncore Fixed Cost Account (“NFCA”). In addition, SoCalGas seeks authorization to transfer any residual balances and eliminate the Natural Gas Appliance Testing Memorandum Account (“NGATMA”) and the Test Year 2012 General Rate Case Memorandum Account (“GRCMA”). SoCalGas will propose the extension of the AMIBA and creation of a new SIMP balancing

account (“SIMPBA”). The proposed regulatory accounts proposals are described in the prepared direct testimony of Reginald Austria (Exhibit SCG-33).

**C. TY 2016 Rates Effective January 1, 2016**

In addition, SoCalGas may seek authorization to establish a regulatory account or mechanism to record the difference between the rates currently in effect for gas service and the final rates adopted in this GRC. This regulatory account/mechanism would be effective January 1, 2016. Similar relief has been granted in SoCalGas’ past GRCs as well as the GRCs of the other California Investor Owned Utilities.

**VI. DESCRIPTION OF REVENUE CHANGES**

The tables below show the allocation of SoCalGas’ gas rate revenues, by customer class, at proposed 2016 rates in comparison to estimated 2015 rates and present 2014 rates.

### VII. IMPLEMENTATION

This GRC Application will result in new rates, effective January 1, 2016. Implementation of the post-test year ratemaking framework, as described in Exhibit SCG-35, will require SoCalGas to file an advice letter in the third quarter of each year specifying the application of the post-test year formula and resulting rates to be effective January 1 of the following year. SoCalGas will file another advice letter on February 15 of each year, setting forth the results of the performance indicators and the earnings sharing adjustment.

### VIII. STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

#### A. Rule 2.1 (a) – (c)

This Application is filed pursuant to P.U. Code Sections 451, 454, 491, 701, 728, 729, 740.4 and 795, the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure and applicable prior Commission decisions, orders and resolutions. In accordance with Rule 2.1 (a) – (c) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas provides the following information.

#### 1. Rule 2.1 (a) - Legal Name

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA GAS COMPANY is a public utility corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of California. SoCalGas owns natural gas transmission

pipelines, compressor plants, distribution pipelines, services and appurtenant meters, regulators, metering and regulating stations, booster stations, general office buildings, regional and district office buildings, general shops, laboratory buildings, warehouses and other storage facilities, supplies and equipment necessary for the operation of its business. In addition, SoCalGas owns underground gas storage reservoirs, transmission and distribution pipelines and facilities used in the provision of safe and reliable gas delivery service to its customers. SoCalGas' principal place of business is 555 West 5th Street, Los Angeles, California 90013.

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**3. Rule 2.1 (c)**

**a. Proposed Category of Proceeding**

In accordance with Rule 7.1, SoCalGas requests that this Application be categorized as ratesetting.

**b. Issues to be Considered**

The principal issues to be considered in this proceeding are as follows:

1. Whether SoCalGas' proposed TY 2016 revenue requirement is just and reasonable, and should be adopted by the Commission and reflected in rates;
2. Whether SoCalGas' regulatory accounts proposals should be adopted;
3. Whether SoCalGas' requested regulatory account amortization is just and reasonable; and
4. Whether SoCalGas' proposed post-test year ratemaking mechanism is just and reasonable, and SoCalGas should be authorized to implement that mechanism through the advice letter process.

**c. Need for Hearings**

SoCalGas anticipates that evidentiary hearings will be necessary.

**d. Proposed Schedule**

The Rate Case Plan contemplates separate evidentiary hearings for an applicant's direct testimony and rebuttal testimony. In recent GRC proceedings, the Commission has consolidated these sets of hearings in the interests of efficiency. Moreover, the Commission has also consolidated the GRC proceedings for SoCalGas and SDG&E, since both utilities file their respective Applications at the same time and share common witnesses. In light of these considerations, SoCalGas suggests the following proposed schedule:

**1. Rule 3.2 (a) (1) – Balance Sheet**

SoCalGas’ balance sheet, income statement and financial statement for the six-month period ending June 30, 2014 are included with this Application as Appendix A.

**2. Rule 3.2 (a) (2) – Statement of Effective Rates**

A statement of SoCalGas’ presently effective rates can be viewed electronically by accessing: <http://www.socalgas.com/regulatory/tariffs/tariff-Book.shtml>. Appendix B to this Application provides the current table of contents from SoCalGas’ tariffs on file with the Commission.

**3. Rule 3.2 (a) (3) – Statement of Proposed Rate Change**

A statement of proposed rate change is attached as Appendix C. This is further discussed in the Revenues at Present and Proposed Rates testimony (Exhibit SCG-37), which are being served concurrently with this Application.

**4. Rule 3.2 (a) (4) – Description of Property and Equipment**

A general description of SoCalGas’ property and equipment was previously filed with the Commission on May 3, 2004 in connection with SoCalGas’ Application 04-05-008, and is incorporated herein by reference. A statement of Original Cost and Depreciation Reserve for the six-month period ending June 30, 2014 is attached as Appendix D.

**5. Rule 3.2 (a) (5) and (6) – Summary of Earnings**

A summary of SoCalGas’ earnings for six-month period ending June 30, 2014, is included as Appendix E to this Application.

**6. Rule 3.2 (a) (7) – Statement re Tax Depreciation**

For financial statement purposes, depreciation of utility plant has been computed on a straight-line remaining life basis, at rates based on the estimated useful lives of plant properties. For federal income tax accrual purposes, SoCalGas generally computes depreciation using the straight-line method for tax property additions prior to 1954, and liberalized depreciation, which includes Class Life and Asset Depreciation Range Systems, on tax property additions after 1954 and prior to 1981. For financial reporting and rate-fixing purposes, “flow through accounting” has been adopted for such properties. For tax property additions in years 1981 through 1986, SoCalGas has computed its tax depreciation using the Accelerated Cost Recovery System. For years after 1986, SoCalGas has computed its tax depreciation using the Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery Systems and, since 1982, has normalized the effects of the depreciation differences in accordance with the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 and the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

**7. Rule 3.2 (a) (8) – Proxy Statement**

A copy of SoCalGas’ most recent proxy statement, dated April 24, 2014, was mailed to the Commission on May 12, 2014, and is incorporated herein by reference.

**8. Rule 3.2 (a) (10) – Statement re Pass Through to Customers**

This GRC Application will seek the Commission’s authorization to revise SoCalGas’ current base rate revenue requirement to recover its projected costs of its operations, as well as owning and operating its natural gas facilities and infrastructure, for the purposes of serving its customers. It is not only a pass through of costs.

**9. Rule 3.2 (b) – Notice to State, Cities and Counties**

In compliance with Rule 3.2 (b) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas will, within twenty days after the filing this Application, mail a notice to the State of California and to the cities and counties in its service territory and to all those persons listed in Appendix F to this Application.

**10. Rule 3.2 (c) – Newspaper Publication**

In compliance with Rule 3.2 (c) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas will, within twenty days after the filing of this Application, publish in newspapers of general circulation in each county in its service territory notice of this Application.

**11. Rule 3.2 (d) – Bill Insert Notice**

In compliance with Rule 3.2 (d) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, SoCalGas will, within 45 days after the filing of this Application, provide notice of this Application to all of its customers along with the regular bills sent to those customers that will generally describe the proposed rate changes addressed in this Application.
