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**QUESTION 05-01:**

Question 01-01.a. of Clean Energy's First Data Request asked the following question:

G-NGV tariffs for each utility under Special Condition 5 read: "All gas used for NGVs, with the exception of NGV home refueling, is required to be under Schedule No. G-NGV."

a. Why has SoCalGas/SDG&E restricted non-residential refueling to Schedule G-NGV?

Sempra's response is unresponsive, stating only that it is "appropriate." Please explain why restricting non-residential refueling to Schedule G-NGV is "appropriate", including all rationale and reasoning for imposing this restriction. Also, please state when this restriction was first imposed.

**RESPONSE 05-01:**

SoCalGas and SDG&E object to the characterization that our previous response was unresponsive. Without waiving this objection, and subject thereto, SoCalGas and SDG&E respond as follows:

SoCalGas and SDG&E have restricted non-residential refueling to Schedule G-NGV because that is what the Commission-approved rate schedule requires. The Commission first authorized SoCalGas and SDG&E to provide refueling to all customers pursuant to Schedule G-NGV in 1991 when it approved Advice Letter 2056.
