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X	Mr. [REDACTED] e said safety is foundational to everything SoCalGas does; but the blowout at nearby Aliso Cyn was one of the worst environmental disasters in U.S. history & lasted more than 5 months! Local residents suffered headaches, nausea, rashes and severe nosebleeds. Dozens of children were seen for severe nosebleeds by school nurses DAILY. SoCalGas had to relocate nearly 3,000 families totalling over 11,000 people! 2 schools had to be relocated. And the greenhouse gas pollution created set the state of California back a whole year on reaching its climate goals. IPCC's August report on the Climate Crisis makes it clear that SoCalGas should be SHUTTING DOWN fossil fuel infrastructure, NOT EXPANDING it. The IEA says no new fossil fuel infrastructure should be built. SoCaGas should be PHASING OUT this compressor station and cleaning up the site.
