We have performed the procedures enumerated below, which were agreed to by management of San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) and Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) (collectively the "Companies"), solely to assist you in evaluating the Companies' executive compensation disclosures as required by subsections (a) and (c) of the California Public Utilities Commission's General Order No. 77-M. Management is responsible for the Companies' compliance with those requirements. This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of those parties specified in the report. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

The procedures we performed are not intended to address legal issues as to whether an item is required to be disclosed nor are they designed to address compensation disclosures required by General Order No. 77-M that are not presented in the Companies' Executive Officers and Employees with a Base Salary of \$250,000 or More Per Annum and Executive Officers of the Utility's Holding Company Summary of Compensation Table, 2008 Options Exercised and Stock Vested Table, 2008 Change in Pension Value and Above-Market Interest Table, or 2008 All Other Compensation Table.

For purposes of performing these agreed-upon procedures, no exceptions were reported for differences of \$1,000 or less resulting solely from the rounding of amounts disclosed.

The following procedures have been performed in relation to the Companies' Executive Officers and Employees with a Base Salary of \$250,000 or More Per Annum and Executive Officers of the Utility's Holding Company. Except as noted in I.A.2(a), I.D.1(a), I.F.1(a) and III.A.1(a), no exceptions were found as a result of applying the procedures.

I. Summary of Compensation

A. Column headed "Name" and "Title"

1. We agreed the "Name" of the executive officers of SD&E and/or SoCalGas to a report extracted from Sempra Energy's MY INFO payroll system identifying employees with a 2008 base salary of \$250,000 or more.
2. We agreed the "Title" of the executive officers of SDG&E and/or SoCalGas to the 2008 Sempra Energy Annual Report, exception was noted as follows:

- a) Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer – The officer resigned during 2008 and was no longer included in the 2008 Sempra Energy Annual Report. The title of Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer was agreed to the 2007 Sempra Energy Annual Report.
3. We agreed the “Name” and “Title” of the named executive officers of Sempra Energy Corporate to Sempra Energy’s Notice of 2009 Annual Meeting of Shareholders and Proxy Statement dated April 30, 2009 (page 33). See results as noted below:

- B. Column headed “Base Salary (\$)”
1. We agreed the 2008 “Base Salary” to the 2008 W-2 Summary Report extracted from Sempra Energy’s MY INFO payroll system.
- C. Column headed “Non Equity Incentive Plan Compensation (\$)”
1. We agreed the 2008 Non-Equity Incentive Plan Compensation to the award amounts approved by the Compensation Committee of the Sempra Energy Board of Directors and the SDG&E and SoCalGas Boards of Directors. We also agreed the award amounts to screen prints from the Sempra Energy MY INFO payroll system.
- D. Column headed “Stock Grants (\$)”
1. We agreed the date and quantity of performance-based restricted shares granted in 2008 as disclosed on the 2008 Performance-Based Restricted Stock Award agreement for each officer to the Personnel Grant Status report from Sempra Energy’s Equity Edge stock tracking system, exception was noted as follows:
 - a) We used the Stock Options and Awards Granted report generated from Sempra Energy’s Equity Edge stock tracking system to agree the stock granted with the Stock Award agreements.
 2. We recalculated the amounts reported in the “Stock Grant” column by multiplying the number of shares granted to each officer by the grant date fair value per share. We calculated the grant date fair value per share by applying a discount for risk associated with the performance measure, as determined by Montgomery Investment Technologies using a Monte Carlo valuation model, to the grant date closing price of Sempra Energy (SRE) common stock.

E. Column headed "Option Grants (\$)"

1. We agreed the date and quantity of nonqualified stock options granted in 2008 as disclosed on the 2008 Nonqualified Stock Option Award agreement for each officer to the Personnel Grant Status report from Sempra Energy's Equity Edge stock tracking system.
2. We recalculated the amounts reported in the "Option Grant" column by multiplying the number of shares granted to each officer by the Black-Scholes value, which was calculated by Hewitt Associates, the independent consultant to the Compensation Committee.

F. Column headed "Change in Pension Value and Nonqualified Deferred Compensation Earnings"

1. We agreed the "Change in Pension Value and Nonqualified Deferred Compensation Earnings" column for each of the Executive Officers and Employees to the total in the "2008 Change in Pension Value and Above-Market Interest for the Year Ended December 31, 2008" table found on page 3 of Section Titled: Executive Officers and Employees with a Base Salary of \$250,000 or More Per Annum and Executive Officers of the Utility's Holding Company, exception was noted as follows:
 - a) The "Change in Pension Value and Nonqualified Deferred Compensation Earnings" of two executives did not agree with the "2008 Change in Pension Value and Above-Market Interest for the Year Ended December 31, 2008" table found on page 3. [Please refer to III.A.1(a) for explanation.]

G. Column headed "All Other Compensation"

1. We agreed "All Other Compensation" column for each of the executive officers and employees to the total in the "2008 All Other Compensation" table found on page 4 of Section Titled: Executive Officers and Employees with a Base Salary of \$250,000 or More Per Annum and Executive Officers of the Utility's Holding Company.

H. Column headed "Ratepayer Allocation"

1. We did not perform any procedures under the three columns of Ratepayer Allocation.

II. 2008 Options Exercised and Stock Vested

A. Column headed "Option Awards (Service-Based Stock Options)"

1. We agreed the "Number of Shares Acquired on Exercise" and the "Value Realized on Exercise" to Confirmation of Exercise reports from Sempra Energy's Equity Edge.

B. Column headed "Stock Awards (Performance-Based Restricted Stock)"

1. We agreed the "Number of Shares Acquired on Vesting" and the "Value Realized on Vesting" to the 12/31/08 Release of January 3, 2005 Restricted Stock Award report. We also used the following additional reports - the February 23, 2004 Awards Vesting 2/23/08, the June 8, 2004 Special Award Vesting 6/8/08 and the June 8, 2004 Special Award Vesting 1/1/08.

III. 2008 Change in Pension Value and Above-Market Interest

A. Column headed "Change in Accumulated Benefits"

1. We agreed the amount shown in the "Change in Accumulated Benefits" column to column H of the Summary Compensation Table exhibit prepared by Towers Perin, Sempra Energy's actuary, exception was noted as follows:
 - a) We agreed the change in accumulated benefits of two executives to the footnote disclosures of the Summary Compensation Table. As stated in the footnote, Securities and Exchange Commission guideline requires negative amounts be shown as \$0 in the Summary Compensation Table. However, the companies may disclose the negative amount in the footnotes to the table.

B. Column headed "Above-Market Interest"

1. We agreed the amounts shown in the "Above-Market Interest" column to the Excess Interest Summary report for each officer who earned above-market interest.
2. We agreed the sum of the "Change in Accumulated Benefits" column and the "Above-Market Interest" column to the "Total" column.

IV. 2008 All Other Compensation for the Year Ended December 31, 2008

A. Column headed "Company 401(k) and Related Plan Contributions"

1. We agreed the amounts shown in the "Company 401(k) and Related Plan Contributions" column to the totals shown for Match and Excess Match on the 2008 Deferrals per EV3 SRERPT reports extracted from Sempra Energy's MY INFO payroll system.

B. Column headed "Insurance Premiums"

1. We agreed the amounts shown in the "Insurance Premiums" column to the amounts shown on the 2008 W-2 Summary Report extracted from Sempra Energy's MY INFO payroll system for personal liability insurance and executive life insurance and to the life insurance premium invoices. We agreed the amounts shown for executive medical, Medjet, and individual supplemental disability insurance to the executive medical premium schedule, the Medjet Membership Renewal Report, and the Met Life Supplemental Disability invoice.

C. Column headed "Tax Reimbursements"

1. We agreed the amounts shown in the "Tax Reimbursements" column to the amounts shown for executive life insurance tax gross-up and tax gross-up on the 2008 W-2 Summary Report extracted from Sempra Energy's MY INFO payroll system.

D. Column headed "Other Executive Benefits"

1. We agreed the amounts shown in the "Other Executive Benefits" column to the amounts shown for car allowance, car premium, and financial planning on the 2008 W-2 Summary Report extracted from Sempra Energy's MY INFO payroll system. We agreed the amounts for personal use of company cars and drivers, executive security systems, and charitable matching contributions to the list of executives with alarm benefits, drivers, and charitable contributions.

E. Column headed "Regular Employee Benefits"

1. We agreed the amounts shown in the "Regular Employee Benefits" column to the amounts shown for company flexible benefits contributions on the 2008 W-2 Summary Report extracted from Sempra Energy's MY INFO payroll system.

V. We confirmed the mathematical accuracy of the following tables:

- A. Summary of Compensation, with the exception of the three columns of the "Ratepayer Allocation", for which we shall not perform any procedure.
- B. 2008 Options Exercised and Stock Vested
- C. 2008 Change in Pension Value and Above-Market Interest
- D. 2008 All Other Compensation

We were not engaged to, and did not perform an audit or examination, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion on the compliance. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

This narrative statement and the amounts reported herein generally follow the presentation included in the Sempra Energy proxy statement and San Diego Gas & Electric and Southern California Gas Company information statement prepared for their annual meetings of shareholders to be held on June 1, 2009. In instances where amounts shown in this report differ from the proxy statement and information statement presentation, footnotes outlining the differences are provided.

1. Base Salaries

The executive compensation programs of San Diego Gas & Electric, Southern California Gas Company and Sempra Energy emphasize performance-based annual bonuses and equity-based long term incentive awards. However, base salaries remain a necessary and standard part of compensation for attracting and retaining outstanding employees at all levels.

Base salaries for executive officers are targeted at the median of those for the Fortune 500 companies. Using national general industry comparisons helps attract and retain top-quality executive talent from a broad range of backgrounds.

Base salaries for executive officers are reviewed annually and the following factors are considered:

- Approximate mid-range of Fortune 500 salary data
- Individual contribution and performance
- Labor market conditions
- Reporting relationships
- Company performance
- Retention needs
- Experience
- Complexity and importance of roles and responsibilities
- Succession planning
- Internal equity

Based on a review of market data, performance and internal equity, base salary adjustments were made on January 1, 2008.

2. Performance-Based Annual Bonuses

Each year, performance guidelines are established for annual bonuses. Consistent with the pay-for-performance philosophy, the guidelines do not provide for any bonus payment unless the threshold (minimum) performance level is attained. Bonus opportunities increase for performance above the threshold level. Performance at target is intended to result in bonuses at the mid-point of those for executives with comparable levels of responsibility at Fortune 500 companies.

Potential bonuses at threshold, target and maximum company performance are expressed as a percentage of each executive officer's base salary. The target bonus potentials and percentages are consistent with the leverage typically found in bonus plans within general industry. Bonus payouts at maximum approximate the 75th percentile of bonus payouts among peer companies. Extraordinary company or individual performance may result in the payment of bonuses above the guidelines.

For a detailed description of individual bonus opportunities, performance measures and 2008 results, please refer to pages 27-28 of the Sempra Energy proxy statement and pages 7-8 of the SDG&E and SoCalGas information statement.

3. Long Term Equity-Based Incentives

Long term equity-based incentives are the largest single component of each executive officer's compensation package. In 2008, the grant date fair value of these awards was 80% in performance-based Sempra Energy restricted stock units and 20% in Sempra Energy stock options.

This mix of stock options and performance-based restricted stock was determined after considering many variables. These included alignment with shareholder interests, plan expense, share usage and market trends.

Through the combination of stock options and performance-based restricted stock, both absolute stock price growth and stock price growth relative to industry peers are rewarded. This creates a strong link between executive pay and shareholder returns over a multi-year performance period.

The estimated grant date fair values of awards to executive officers have generally been between the median and the 75th percentile of market data.

Performance-based restricted stock units:

Stock options are an important component of shareholder-aligned executive compensation; however, a more direct link to performance in comparison to indexes and peers was sought. To achieve this result, performance-based restricted stock units are used as the major component of the equity grants.

Each performance-based restricted stock unit represents the right to receive between zero and 1.5 shares of Sempra Energy common stock based on the company's four-year cumulative total shareholder return compared to the S&P Utilities Index as shown below:

**If the company ranks at or above the 50th percentile compared to the S&P 500 Index, participants will receive a minimum of 1.0 shares.*

Sempra Energy's relative total shareholder return from 2005 to 2008 met the 66th percentile of the S&P 500 Utilities Index. As a result, 100% of the performance-based restricted stock for the 2005-2008 Long Term Incentive Plan cycle was released to plan participants after the committee certified performance results.

Stock Options:

While playing a lesser role in the Sempra Energy utilities current pay program, Sempra Energy stock options remain an appropriate and highly motivating vehicle for delivering long term incentives. Stock options become exercisable in equal annual installments over a four-year period. Options provide a direct link with shareholder interests, as they have no compensation value unless Sempra Energy's stock price increases above the grant date price.

For information on individual awards as a percentage of base salary, please refer to page 28 of the Sempra Energy proxy statement and page 8 of the SDG&E and SoCalGas information statement.

Benefit Plans

Executive officers also participate in other benefit programs including: 1) Health, Life Insurance and Disability Plans; 2) Retirement Plans; 3) Savings and Deferred Compensation Plans; and 4) Other Benefit Programs.

1. Health, Life Insurance and Disability Plans

Executive officers participate in life, disability, medical and dental insurance group plans that are available to virtually all employees. These are common benefits essential to attracting a high-quality workforce.

In addition to the basic group plans, certain executive officers also participate in the following:

- A Medical Insurance Plan providing up to \$20,000 (the annual aggregate maximum) in additional coverage for medically necessary care for the officer or covered dependents.
- A Life Insurance Plan providing additional life insurance death benefits (two times base salary and bonus for active employees and one times base salary and bonus for retired employees).
- A Long Term Disability Plan providing additional protection upon disability (60% of base salary and average bonus) and restoring benefits otherwise capped under the company's basic Long Term Disability Plan.

When executive officers retire, they continue to participate in the health insurance plans generally provided to virtually all employees.

2. Retirement Plans

Executive officers participate in the Cash Balance and Cash Balance Restoration Pension Plans and a Supplemental Executive Retirement Plan.

The Cash Balance Plan is a tax-qualified pension plan available to most employees. Executive officers also participate with numerous other employees in a Cash Balance Restoration Plan. This plan restores the benefits that would have been payable under the Cash Balance Plan but for Internal Revenue Code limitations on tax-qualified plans.

The Supplemental Executive Retirement Plan provides executive officers with retirement benefits based on the executive's final average pay, years of service, and age at retirement. SERP benefits are reduced by benefits payable under the broad-based Cash Balance Plan and Cash Balance Restoration Plan.

Each plan uses only base salary and annual incentive bonuses in calculating benefits. The value of long term incentive awards is not included.

Retirement, savings and deferred compensation plans, in general, and the SERP in particular, are important elements of an overall compensation package. This package is designed to recruit and retain executive talent, especially mid-career executives, and to retain longer term executive participants. Supplemental retirement plans, together with savings and deferred compensation plans, are prevalent benefits within Fortune 500 companies.

3. Savings and Deferred Compensation Plans

Executive officers, together with most other employees, also participate in a broad-based, tax-qualified 401(k) Savings Plan.

Employees may contribute a portion of their pay to the plan for investment on a tax-deferred basis. The Sempra Energy utilities match one-half of the first 6% of the employee's contributions. They also make an additional contribution of up to 1% of base pay if Sempra Energy meets or exceeds annual earnings targets. The Internal Revenue Code limits the amount of compensation eligible for deferral under tax-qualified plans. These benefits are restored through a deferred compensation plan. All employee contributions, matching company contributions, and investment earnings vest immediately.

Executive officers also may defer up to 100% of their base salary and bonus under a Deferred Compensation Plan. These deferrals may be directed into funds that mirror the investments available under the 401(k) Savings Plans, including a Sempra Energy phantom stock account, or into a fund providing interest at the greater of 110% of the Moody's Corporate Bond Yield or Moody's plus 1%.

4. Other Executive Benefits Programs

Other typical benefits are provided to executive officers. The level and types of these benefits are reviewed each year to ensure that they are reasonable and important in attracting and retaining executive talent.

These benefits include financial planning services and excess personal liability insurance. In lieu of reimbursement for mileage and other automobile expenses, executives have traditionally received car allowances. However, car allowances were eliminated mid-year 2007 with a compensating increase in base salary. The Chief Executive Officer of Sempra Energy and the Chief Executive Officer and the Chief Operating Officer of SDG&E and SoCalGas are provided with an executive security specialist for personal and business driving in the context of an overall security plan.

5. Regular Employee Benefits

The SEC's proxy rules, for the most part, do not require reporting of broad-based employee benefit plans such as those providing medical, dental, life or disability coverage. However, amounts related to broad-based pension benefits and the 401(k) savings plan are discussed in the Compensation Discussion and Analysis and reported in the executive compensation tables.

The companies' flexible benefits plan allows employees to select the types and levels of benefits that best meet their needs and those of their families. Benefit options include:

- Medical plans (choice of three HMO's, a point-of-service plan, and an indemnity plan)
- Dental plans (choice of Delta Dental plan and dental HMO)
- Long-term disability coverage
- Life insurance
- Accident insurance
- Healthcare, Dependent day care and Transportation flexible spending accounts
- Vacation buy and Vacation sell

Each benefit option has a price tag reflecting the employee's cost for coverage. Employees are provided with "flex dollars", which reflect the companies' contributions toward the cost of benefits. The amounts shown in the Regular Benefits column of the All Other Compensation table in this report reflect the flex dollars provided by the companies.

Flex dollars are allocated based on the employee's benefit selections, which are made during annual open enrollment. If the employee's total benefit price tag exceeds the total flex dollars, the additional cost is deducted from the employee's paycheck through pre-tax payroll contributions as permitted under Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code.

In addition to the flexible benefit plan, the companies also provide short-term counseling and referral services under the employee assistance plans and various wellness programs.


