**Subject: Revision to Schedule Nos. GM, Multi-Family Service, and G-CARE,
California Alternative Rates for Energy Program**

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) hereby submits for filing with the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) revisions to its tariff schedules, applicable throughout its service territory, as shown in Attachment B.

Purpose

This filing revises Schedule Nos. GM and G-CARE in compliance with Assembly Bill (AB) 2857, which amended Public Utilities Code Section 739.5 to grant eligibility for the California Alternative Rates for Energy (CARE) program to residential users of gas service who are submetered and reside in master-metered multi-family dwelling units or mobile home parks in which not all of the individual units are submetered, and Ordering Paragraph (OP) 105 of Decision (D.) 08-11-031, which directs the four major investor-owned utilities (IOUs) to update their tariffs.

Background

Prior to the approval of AB 2857 and issuance of D.08-11-031, for SoCalGas' residential submetered customers to be eligible for the CARE program, all of the individual dwelling units in multi-family dwellings and mobile home parks served through a master meter, that is, served through one meter, on a single premises were required to be submetered.

On September 28, 2008, the State Legislature passed AB 2857, which amended Section 739.5 of the Public Utilities Code by adding the following section to the code:

(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or decision of the commission, the commission shall not deny eligibility for the California Alternative Rates for Energy (CARE) program, created pursuant to Section 739.1, for a residential user of gas or electric service who is a submetered resident or tenant served by a master-meter customer on the basis that some residential units in the master-meter customer's mobilehome park, apartment building, or similar residential complex do not receive gas or electric service through a submetered system.

AB 2857 requires the Commission to grant eligibility for the CARE program to residential users of gas service who are submetered and reside in master-metered multi-family dwellings or mobile home parks in which not all of the individual units are submetered.

On November 10, 2008, the Commission issued D.08-11-031 in Application (A.) 08-05-025 with an effective date of November 6, 2008. OP 105 of D.08-11-031 states:

“We order IOUs to update their tariffs in order to comply with the amendment to AB 2857 (Lieber) within 60 days of the effective date of this decision.”

Proposed Changes

Schedule No. GM, Sheet 1, Applicability, is revised to add the following language after the sixth paragraph:

“This schedule is applicable to income-qualified households that meet the requirements for the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) as set forth in Schedule No. G-CARE.”

Schedule No. G-CARE, Sheet 1, Applicability, item 2, is revised. The language that describes a type of customer that meets the requirement for CARE eligibility is revised to the following language which no longer excludes a residential user of gas service who is submetered and resides in master-metered multi-family dwelling or mobile home park in which not all of the individual units are submetered from being eligible for the CARE program:

“Multi-family dwelling units and mobile home parks supplied through one meter on a single premises where the individual unit is submetered.”

Protest

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the California Public Utilities Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received within 20 days of the date this Advice Letter. There is no restriction on who may file a protest. This schedule is closed as of July 13, 1978 for gas service to: (a) new residential Mobilehome Parks where such Mobilehome Park tenants use gas directly in gas appliances in each occupancy; and (b) new Multi-family Accommodation structures where such multi-unit tenants use gas directly in gas appliances in each occupancy and which require venting, except where equipped with only vented decorative appliances.

Applicable to natural gas procurement service for Multi-family Accommodations supplying Baseline uses only or in a combination of Baseline uses and common facilities through one meter on a premises, in accordance with the provisions of Rule No. 24. Such gas service will be billed under rates designated for GM-E, GM-BE or GM-BEC, as appropriate. This schedule also applies to accommodations defined in Rule No. 1 as Residential Hotels. Natural gas supplied through a single meter to common facilities (swimming pools, recreation rooms, saunas, spas, etc.) only, will be billed under rates designated for GM-C, GM-BC or GM-BCC, as appropriate.

Master metered Customers who have averaged at least 100,000 therms of weather-normalized usage for the previous two calendar years, January through December, will be billed under the GMB rate which includes the GM-BE, GM-BC, GM-BEC, GM-BCC, GT-MBE and GT-MBC rates. Submetered customers are not eligible for GMB rates.

The cross-over rate (GM-EC, GM-CC, GM-BEC and GM-BCC) is a core procurement option for Multi-family Accommodation residential core transportation customers with annual consumption over 50,000 therms as set forth in Special Condition 10.

The GT-ME, GT-MC, GT-MBE and GT-MBC rate is applicable to Core Aggregation Transportation service, as set forth in Special Condition 11, for Baseline uses and/or common facilities as described in paragraph 2 above.

Multi-family Accommodations built prior to July 13, 1978 and served under GM rate may also be eligible for service under Schedule No. GS. If an eligible Multi-family Accommodation or residential hotel served under GM rate converts to an applicable submetered tariff, the tenant rental charges shall be revised for the duration of the lease to reflect removal of the energy related charges.

This schedule is applicable to income-qualified households that meet the requirements for the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) as set forth in Schedule No. G-CARE.

Eligibility for service hereunder is subject to verification by the Utility.

CALIFORNIA ALTERNATE RATES FOR ENERGY (CARE) PROGRAM

APPLICABILITY

This schedule provides a California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) discount to each of the following types of customers listed below that meets the requirements for CARE eligibility as defined in Rule No. 1, Definitions, and herein, and is taken in conjunction with the customer's otherwise applicable service schedule.

1. Customers residing in a permanent single-family accommodation, separately metered by the Utility.
2. Multi-family dwelling units and mobile home parks supplied through one meter on a single premises where the individual unit is submetered.
3. Non-profit group living facilities.
4. Agricultural employee housing facilities.

TERRITORY

Applicable throughout the service territory.

DISCOUNT

The qualified customer will receive a 20% CARE discount on all customer, commodity, and transportation charges on their otherwise applicable service schedule. In addition, the customer will not pay the CARE portion of the Public Purpose Programs Surcharge as specified in Schedule No. G-PPPS.

The qualified customer shall also pay a discounted CARE Service Establishment Charge as specified in Rule No. 10, Service Charges, to establish or re-establish service each time an account is opened.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

ALL CUSTOMERS

1. Applicable Conditions: All special conditions contained in the customer's otherwise applicable schedule are applicable to service under this schedule.
2. Application and Eligibility Declaration: An application and eligibility declaration, on a form authorized by the Commission, is required for service under the CARE program unless otherwise authorized by the Commission. Renewal of a customer's eligibility declaration, also referred to as recertification, is required at the request of the Utility.
3. Commencement of CARE Discount: Eligible customers shall begin receiving the CARE rate discount no later than one billing period after receipt of a completed and approved application by the Utility or as may be authorized by the Commission.
