

## hat is Natural Gas?



Natural gas plays an important role in our lives. Gas fireplaces and heaters keep us warm in the winter. Some stoves also use natural gas to boil water and cook food. Natural gas travels through underground pipelines to reach our homes. SoCalGas tests these pipelines regularly to make sure there are no dangerous natural gas leaks. There are also steps you can take to stay safe around natural gas. Keep reading to learn how!



#### How to Sense a Gas Leak


## **Steps to Safety**

What should you do if you see bubbling water, hear a strange sound or smell an unusual natural gas odor? When you notice signs of a natural gas leak, it's important to avoid danger by

following these steps. Read about each step and then solve the maze.

> Ask them to call 911 immediately. You must report the possible natural gas leak so someone can fix it.

Tell a parent, a teacher or another adult about what you smelled, saw



Get as far away as possible as quickly as possible. FINISH

If you see a fire, don't go near it. When fire comes into contact with natural gas, it is very dangerous.

## Help Prevent Gas Leaks with 811

When something comes into contact with natural gas pipelines, a leak can occur. That's why it's important to avoid gas pipelines when you dig. There are also electrical wires, water pipes and other utility lines under the ground. An adult should contact 811 at least two business days before you start building a fence, planting a tree or doing any digging. They can call 811 or visit california811.org. Mark the area where you plan to dig with white chalk or paint. A worker will come place flags or other markings to show you where there are underground lines. Color the flags using the key to learn about what these markings mean.




Do not move any 🖢 flags you may see after contacting 811. Leave them in place until your digging project is done.

## Dig Smart, Dig Safe

What should you do if there's a flag close to your digging area? To stay safe, always use a hand tool instead of a large digging machine within 24 inches of a flag. Digging carefully will help you avoid a natural gas pipe or other line. Look at the flags and digging areas in each picture. **Determine the safest choice** and draw a machine or hand tool.
