What is the California Climate Credit?

A Message from the California Public Utilities



This month* your natural gas bill will include a credit of \$86.60 identified as the "California Climate Credit." Your household and millions of others throughout the state will receive this credit on your utility bills.

The California Climate Credit is a direct result of the State's nation-leading Cap-and-Trade Program that requires polluters to pay for climate pollution. Credits are distributed in April each year. Credits appear automatically on your bill and are designed to help utility customers during the transition to a more sustainable future.

Since 2018, California's SoCalGas households like yours have already received an average of \$268 in California Climate Credits on your natural gas utility bills, totaling nearly \$3.5 billion in Cap-and-Trade Program cumulative benefits statewide.
